Uses everyday examples and beautiful West Coast imagery to demonstrate how children use bravery to

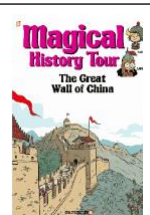

The thrilling conclusions to Canadian Author Kenneth Oppel's epic Bloom trilogy.



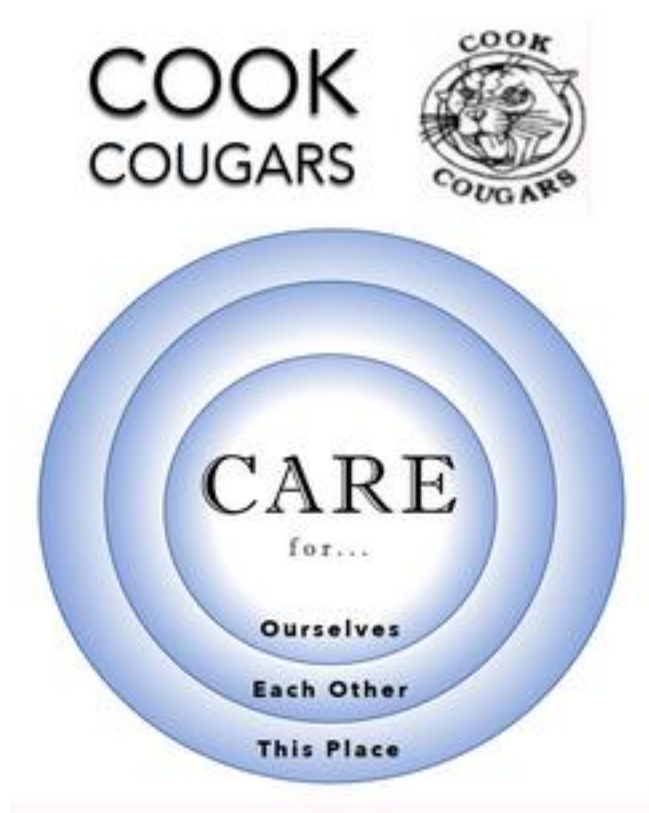
Magical History Tour #2 The Great Wall of China
