
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Accessing Learning through Music

Students adapted lyrics from Taylor Swift to show their understanding of emotional literacy.

<u>A.</u> Learners began by developing their background knowledge by:

- 1. Naming feelings
- 2. Making a feelings word wall
- 3. Representing their understanding of feelings through loose parts
- **B.** Students began to take their thinking deeper by exploding the lyrics to stretch their thinking about what the song means.
- C. Students shared how emotions feel in their body.
- <u>D.</u> Finally, students put all of their thinking together to create a song that they shared with the whole school.
